Roosters food drive benefits KofC charities

On Sunday, Dec. 19, nine Brother Knights with friends and family participated in the annual Roosters Food Drive at Second Harvest.

The Roosters is an organization of 100 Orange County businessmen who support children in need within our local community.

Roosters raised funds to fill 3,500 food boxes that are estimated to provide 25,000 meals.

Each box has at least a 14 pound turkey and plenty of fresh vegetables, food bars, potatoes, rice, drinks, snacks, and even toys for children.

Roosters' cost was approximately \$30 per box and our Council was fortunate to receive 62.

Our Council sent boxes to Micah's House, CASA Orange County, Title IV Santa Ana USD, and families in need in our own

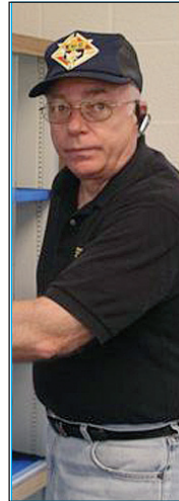

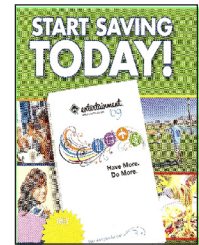
Travel discounts up to 70 percent are also part of the package.

This is a very worthwhile Charity and meets all the precepts of the Knights.

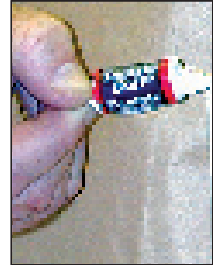
