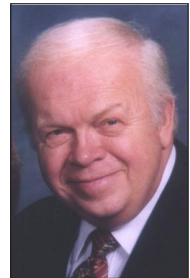

## K of C the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization

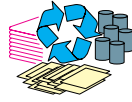


With more than 1.6 million members throughout North America and the rest of the world, the Knights of Columbus is the world's largest Catholic family fraternal service organization.

This month all Knights and their families are invited and encouraged to attend the annual Memorial Mass in honor of the deceased Brother Knights of our Council.

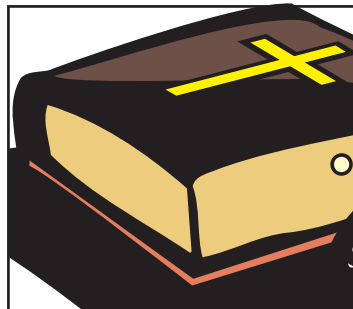
The Mass will be celebrated at 7 p.m., Wednesday Nov. 9, at Santiago de Compostella.

Thanks Randy, for a job well done.

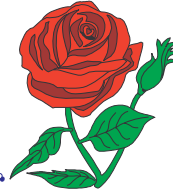
