Check out our website for two key insurance features

If you haven't visited the Knights of Columbus website in a while, I encourage you to do so the next time you're online.

There are many exciting features on www.kofc.org, but there are two I wish to make you especially aware of.



The first is our member testimonial area, "Stages of Life." In this multi-media area, six "real-life" stories are told about folks at different stages of their lives. Chances are one of them will sound a lot like you.

These people talk about how their Knights of Columbus agent took the time to demonstrate for them the need for life insurance in their lives. I'll be happy to do that for you and your family as well.

The second is our Life Insurance Calculator. This handy, easy-to-use online tool was developed to allow you, in about 15-20 minutes, to estimate the amount of life insurance coverage you need.

The information you'll be asked to provide will be basic (the type most folks would tend to have at their fingertips), and secure (it's intended to be used solely for the purposes of the online calculator. The Order won't capture it or share it with anyone,

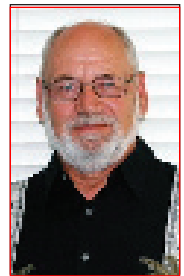

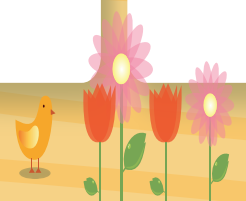
