Insurance Report

Sometimes, beneficiaries can change

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could be that the person you originally selected is no longer the person you would want to receive he policy proceeds.

If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since been married, that could be updated to reflect your spouse, and even your children.

Most people list a primary beneficiary and that person is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds.

We also encourage naming a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy when it was first issued. One of the matters I'll discuss is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.
