'For Greater Glory' highly recommended

For Greater Glory – starring Andy Garcia, Eva Longoria and Peter O'Toole – is the true story of how the Catholic Church, through a three-year conflict called the Cristero War, won its freedom from the government of Mexico.

The film will soon be showing at the Regal Cinemas in Foothill Ranch and several other venues.

Pope Benedict XVI, during his recent visit to Mexico, visited the Cristo Rey Monument that honors the Cristero fighters. They took up arms in 1926 when the Mexican government outlawed and forcibly suppressed the Catholic faith. That included the public execution of priests and parishioners by hanging and firing squad.

Many were martyred for the freedom the Cristero fighters eventually won in 1929.

"For Greater Glory is an excellent film that has the courage to tell a story that has been all but forgotten," Archbishop Lori, Supreme Chaplain, said. "The sacrifices and hardships endured by those who would not renounce Christ helped preserve the religious liberty of millions, and this film honors their memory in a remarkable way. For Greater Glory also reminds us of how much has been done to pass this liberty on to our generation by those who came before us, and it makes clear the truth that Christ taught us - that there is no greater love than to lay down one's life for a friend."

Please make every effort to see the movie the weekend of June 1-3. This will ensure further distribution of the film.
