# Some changes proposed for Council budget

To the right is a summary of this Columbian year budget for your Council.

It shows last year's proposed and actual figures and what is proposed by major category. There are some changes proposed I will mention.

Under charitable income we are increasing the income proposed for "Keep Christ in Christmas" cards.

The expense has also been increased. Under golf tournament income we show a lower figure since we took in much of this year's program income in last year's actual figures.

We are considering increasing the monthly donation expense to Birth Choice by \$50 a month. This is being offset by eliminating our monthly donation expense of \$50 to St. Vincent de Paul.

Another large expense savings is in this Newsletter. We hope to eliminate mailing most of them.
