

9487 HOSTS ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL BLOOD DRIVE

One of the most impressive statistics from this blood drive is that 28% of the donors were first time donors, thanks to the recruiting efforts of Brothers Jose Lopez and Ricardo Teano.

There are 51 appointments available for the blood drive which went from 1:30pm to 7:30pm. We had 49 of these appointments reserved. 39 donors followed through with their appointments. The Red Cross had assigned our blood drive with the goal of collecting 37 units of blood and exactly 37 units of blood were collected.

Brothers Jose Lopez and Mark Angel worked at the blood drive checking in the donors. Brother Ricardo Teano attended the event to show support for those who donated blood. Thank you to all of you who donated your blood, you are truly helping save lives.

As always the Red Cross workers said that our blood drive is the most organized, best run drive in orange county!


