

Our "**Saint of the Month**" for March is St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. She is perhaps most famous for her visions of Jesus leading to the devotion to His **Sacred Heart**. This is a powerful devotion in the Church, and one that seemed much more popular during my days as an altar server in the Boston suburbs as a kid. Like Padre Pio, St. Margaret Mary was doubted by many during and after her short life, and wasn't canonized until 230 years after her death. Her devotion to the Sacred Heart was initially fostered after her death by the Jesuits, and it was controversial at the time.



She was born in 1647 in France, and from an early age showed an intense love for the Blessed Sacrament. She experienced visions of Jesus Christ for most of her life, but always thought this was normal. She died at the age of 43, and her final words were, "I need nothing but God, and to lose myself in the heart of Jesus." Her body was exhumed 200 years after her death and found incorrupt.

May almighty God Bless and protect us and our families. St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, pray for us! Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us!



## Looking for 2026 Weekly Recycling Team Members

*The recycling area is known as the Barn so we call the weekly recycling teams 'Barn Duty'. We create 3-4 person teams and assign the same week each month to the team so they can handle any recyclables left in the dropoff area from Monday to Sunday putting in around 3-4 hrs of volunteer hours on their assigned week. You will be trained and have your own key so you can recycle on your own schedule after you coordinate with your team members. You do not need to be retired. A number of our current volunteers are working fulltime jobs so we recycle before or after work and on the weekends, once again only 1 week per month for a few hours. The Barn Duty teams handle about 50% of the recyclables dropped off so they are an important part of the Recycling program. 


